



CAMPO DE BORJA

The Campo de Borja district is located in the northwest of the province of Zaragoza, about 60 km from the capital. It is a transition zone between the mountains of the Iberian System and the Ebro Valley.

Human beings already inhabited this region more than a hundred thousand years ago, and over time there have been various cultures that have left us their legacy. The development of Celtiberian culture in the area is noteworthy, particularly the metallurgical settlements. Thanks to the region's location and the proximity of the Ebro Valley, we have abundant Mudéjar ruins, as well as important examples of religious, civil and military architecture. Since the 17th century, there has been a significant presence of the military orders of the Templars and Hospitallers, which had several orders in the region. One characteristic of the territory that defines its cultural landscape is the hillside wineries.

The Campo de Borja district is characterized by strong geographical contrasts and a variety of landscapes. The Huecha River forms the spine in the north of the territory, running from east to west, entering through the border of Bulbuente and leaving it through Novillas, crossing groves and orchards on its way. The tourist destination of the Garnacha Route comprises those municipalities whose cultural landscape enjoys the distinction of being a Touristic Place of Interest of Aragon.


